Your children can look forward to showing off the wonderful skills they have developed over their time in KS2.

<u>High School Applications</u>

The closing date for submitting a Year 7 2026 school application is *31th October 2025.* in Tameside. Applications submitted after this date will be processed as a 'late' application. Please remember to submit your application online at https://www.tameside.gov.uk/admissions/ssa

<u>Unilorm</u>

A polite reminder that all children in Year 6 need to wear their full school uniform each day which includes their shirt and tie. Please note, as part of our uniform policy, children are not permitted to wear PE pumps.

<u> P.E</u>

P.E will take place on Monday AND FRIDAY. On PE days, children should come to school dressed in their PE kits. Please note, this should be:

- black shorts or tracksuit bottoms;
- a white t-shirt;
- a black jacket.

All children need to have trainers for outdoor PE sessions - pumps cannot be worn.

Football tops and other branded items should not be worn.

Jewellery is strictly forbidden for PE. Earrings must not be worn to school on PE days.

During the Autumn term, Year 6 will be attending swimming lessons. These lessons will take place on a Friday. Children should come to school in their PE kits and bring their swimming kits with them.

Appropriate swimwear must be worn to each swimming lesson. Swimwear should be a one-piece swimming costume for girls and swimming trunks for boys. The children are allowed to wear swimming shorts that are lined and are not below mid-thigh in length and which will not hamper swimming development. <u>Readina</u>
